

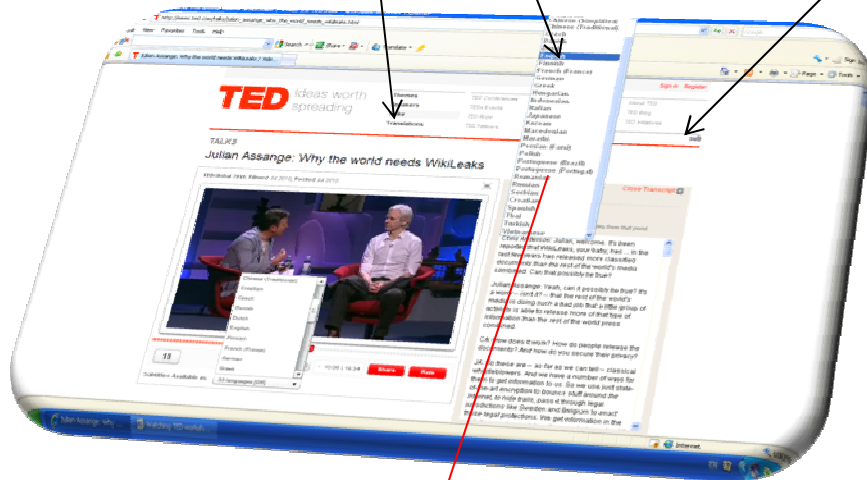
log into [www.ted.com](http://www.ted.com) and choose a lecture that interests you. **Think about** the title of the lecture and what you know about the subject.

Change the language of the transcript here.

While you watch ...make notes of the main points of the lecture.

Choose a different lecture here.

Open and close the transcript here.



Change the subtitles here.

Click on any part of the transcript to listen again.

## Finding it difficult?

1. Just focus on the **first 5 minutes** of the lecture. Do the rest another time.
2. First time – watch with **no subtitles**. Try to follow the lecture. Then watch it again **with subtitles** or open the **interactive transcript**.
3. A lot of the lectures have translations. You might want to **watch in English** and follow the transcript in your first language.

## Need some help?

1. TRY to **write down a phrase**, NOT just one word.
2. TRY to **guess the meaning from the context**.
3. If you're studying IELTS, copy the transcript into [http://www.lex Tutor.ca/concordancers/concord\\_e.html](http://www.lex Tutor.ca/concordancers/concord_e.html) to focus on the **academic word list**.
4. Ask a teacher to explain it to you.
